## 2nd International Conference on Asian Studies

Second International Conference on Asian Studies (ICAS) collaboratively organized by the International Center for Research and Development (ICRD) and the International University of Japan (IUJ) was held on 14-15 July 2014 at Colombo, Sri Lanka. Prof. N.S. Cooray delivering the keynote speech identified key focus of the conference as identifying true potentials of the Asia to make 21st century an "Asian Century." These researchers received high appreciation among the

scientific community present in the conference since they discussed highly concerned issues in Asian context.



Overall the conference gave an opportunity to be aware of research conducted on a wide range of themes including socio-economic, cultural and environmental matters that would become keys in determining growth of Asian nations. In addition, interactive discussions provide an opportunity to focus on the diverse nature of a sociological phenomenon.

Conference was accompanied by dinner which depicted diverse and unique nature of Sri Lankan cuisine and study tour to historic city Kandy provided exposure to rich culture Sri Lanka boast about.
